PSEO OPTIONS

Crown is excited to offer Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) to qualified South Heights students. PSEO is a Minnesota program that allows 11th and 12th-grade students to enroll in free college courses that earn them credits simultaneously for both their high school diploma and college degree at no cost.

At Rise Up, students take classes in a hybrid format in which Crown's online instructor partners with a Course Assistant from Rise Up to provide an in-person educational experience. These courses have a low student-to-instructor ratio and high success rate.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Crown PSEO Scholarships are available to students who attend Crown PSEO and then enroll as full-time first-year students the following academic year. PSEO scholarship is \$1000 per year, and students from Rise Up are eligible to receive a Crown Christian Home School Partner Grant of \$2,000 per year. Contact Admissions for more information.

COLLEGE ALGEBRA - MAT 131 (3 Cr)

This course provides a short review of Algebra II, followed by a concise study of algebraic, polynomial, exponential and logarithmic functions and their graphs. Linear, quadratic and systems of equations are included, along with their applications. Prerequisite: High School Algebra II

INTRO to COMPUTER APPLICATIONS - IT 1060 (3 Cr)

A practical introduction to common computer software applications for workplace settings including programs for word processing, spreadsheets and presentation. Students learn through hands on activities and applied projects.

GENERAL PSYCHOLOGY - PSY 130 (3 Cr)

This course is designed to provide a broad overview of the field of psychology. Topics include research in psychology, the brain and nervous system, sensation and perception, memory, emotion, learning, psychological disorders and psychotherapy. This introductory course aims to help students think deliberately and skillfully about human behavior and mental processes.

SPANISH I - LAN 255 (4 Cr)

This course introduces the student to the sounds, basic vocabulary, and structures of the Spanish language through listening, speaking, reading and writing, and beginning awareness of the cultural context of the language. Communicative skills are reinforced through practice in integrated laboratory activities.

SOCIOLOGY - SOC 230 (3 Cr)

This is a survey course of the basic concepts in the sociological study of society, culture, the self, social organizations, the range of associational life, and social process.

MATHEMATICS SURVEY - MAT 130 (3 Cr)

A mathematics course designed for the liberal arts or general education purposes, including quantitative literacy and mathematical competency. The course consists of problem solving and mathematical modeling. Topics include set theory, operations, percent and decimals, linear equations and their applications, slopes, parallel and perpendicular lines, systems of equations, counting techniques, probability and descriptive statistics.

CONCEPTS of PERSONAL FINANCE - BUS 130 (3 Cr)

A practical study of what Scripture says about financial stewardship, tithing, giving, investing, and the use of debt. Students will develop personal budgets and financial goals. Discussion will also include the use of various types of credit and insurance.

DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY - PSY 236 (3 Cr)

Human psychological development from birth to death is studied. Consideration is given to psychological, emotional, cognitive, social, moral, and spiritual development and experiences.

Prerequisite: PSY 130 General Psychology

SPANISH II - LAN 256 (4 Cr)

This builds on the work of Spanish I as an introduction to the sounds, vocabulary, and structures of the Spanish language through listening, speaking, reading and writing as well as awareness of the cultural context of the language. Communicative skills are reinforced through practice in integrated laboratory activities. Prerequisite: LAN 255 Spanish I
