PSEO OPTIONS

Crown is excited to offer Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) to qualified WEST students. PSEO is a Minnesota program that allows 11th and 12th-grade students to enroll in free college courses that earn them credits simultaneously for both their high school diploma and college degree at no cost.

At WEST, students take classes in a hybrid format in which Crown's online instructor partners with a Course Assistant from WEST to provide an in-person educational experience. These courses have a low student-to-instructor ratio and high success rate.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Crown PSEO Scholarships are available to students who attend Crown PSEO and then enroll as full-time first-year students the following academic year. PSEO scholarship is \$1,000 per year, and students from WEST are eligible to receive a Crown Christian Home School Partner Grant of \$2,000 per year. Contact Admissions for more information.

Fall Semester 2026 Aug 26-Dec 18**College Writing and Research - ENG 1510 (3 Cr)**

This course emphasizes the fundamentals of effective writing in the context of the elements of rhetoric: writer, audience, and purpose.

Survey of American Literature - ENG 2510 (3 Cr)

An overview of non-dramatic literature of the United States, showing its development from colonial times to the present.

Topics in World Civilizations - HIS 1510 (3 Cr)

This course is an introductory course on selected topics in the history of major world civilizations that have shaped the foundations of mankind; from the earliest records of humankind through approximately 1500 AD.

Spanish I - LAN 255 (4 Cr)

This course introduces the student to the sounds, basic vocabulary, and structures of the Spanish language through listening, speaking, reading and writing, and beginning awareness of the cultural context of the language.

American Government - POL 2510 (3 Cr)

This course examines the politics and processes of American government at the national, state and local level: the constitutional foundations of American government; national institutions, chiefly the presidency,

Foundations of Biology - SCI 1531 (4 Cr)

This course is designed to give insight, appreciation, and understanding of the plant and animal world. Major concepts covered include cellular biology, biochemistry, photosynthesis and respiration, genetics, and embryology. Includes lab requirement.

Sociology - SOC 230 (3 Cr)

This is a survey course of the basic concepts in the sociological study of society, culture, the self, social organizations, the range of associational life, and social process.

College Writing and Research Augmented - ENG 1511 P1 (1 Cr) *Online

This course is offered in conjunction with [ENG 1510 - College Writing and Research](#). Students will learn about the process of writing a critical essay. Take this online class concurrently with ENG 1510

Topics in World Civilizations Augmented - HIS 1511 P1 (1 Cr) *Online

This course is offered in conjunction with of [HIS 1510 - Topics in World Civilizations](#). Students will do an in-depth study of a specific ancient civilization and write a research paper. Take concurrently with HIS 1510

Spring Semester 2027 Jan 13-May 14**Public Communication - COM 1515 (3 Cr)**

This course provides the student with an introduction to the theory of the communication process. Topics include analyzing a target audience, organizing material, preparing an effective method of delivery, and developing informative and persuasive speeches. Each student will deliver speeches.

Introduction to Literary Analysis - ENG 1512 (3 Cr)

Continued instruction and practice in writing and the writing process are the focal points of this course, with emphasis on critical analysis of literary genres.

Topics in US History - HIS 2520 (3 Cr)

The course will examine political, social, economic, and international dimensions of the history of the United States. It aims to stimulate both an analytical and a moral understanding of critical issues from the nation's pasts.

Spanish II - LAN 256 (4 Cr)

This builds on the work of Spanish I as an introduction to the sounds, vocabulary, and structures of the Spanish language through listening, speaking, reading and writing as well as awareness of the cultural context of the language. Communicative skills are reinforced through practice in integrated laboratory activities. Prerequisite: LAN 255 or consent of the instructor

Art Appreciation - FAR 1560 (3 Cr)

An introductory study of art appreciation that examines significant art and artists associated with major art movements with a special emphasis on historic and contemporary art reflecting Christian beliefs. Content and knowledge emerge from the study of the elements and principles of art to acquire a vocabulary and understanding of the meaning and purpose of visual imagery and an overview of the development of art throughout history to the present.

General Psychology - PSY 130 (3 Cr)

This course is designed to provide a broad overview of the field of psychology. Topics include research in psychology, the brain and nervous system, sensation and perception, memory, emotion, learning, psychological disorders and psychotherapy.

Science of Health and Wellness - SCI 1515 (3 Cr)

The course will focus on various aspects of living a healthy lifestyle including exercise, nutrition, and stress management. Students will gain an understanding of basic exercise principles and exercise programming, how nutrition contributes to overall health and the interactions between psychological health and physical health. Course assignments will encourage students to incorporate wellness activities into their daily lives. Additionally, the course will explore spiritual aspects of wellness.

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
